## **Color of Education**

The Public School Forum of North Carolina, in partnership with Duke Policy Bridge and the Samuel DuBois Cook Center on Social Equity, will present in October the first in a planned series of statewide events on race and education: **Color of Education: An Evening with Nikole Hannah-Jones.** 

The impact of race in education was a central focus of the Public School Forum's Study Group XVI: Expanding Education Opportunity in North Carolina. The Committee on Racial Equity's <u>findings and recommendations</u> were published in October 2016, covering issues such as resegregation, teacher diversity, discipline disparity and lack of access to advanced coursework for students of color.

In 2019 and beyond, the Forum's "Color of Education" series (#ColorOfEducation) will evolve into an annual statewide summit, as well as other regional events, bringing together educators, policymakers, experts and key stakeholders focused on achieving racial equity and eliminating racial disparities in education.



#### Nikole Hannah-Jones

A UNC-Chapel Hill graduate school alumnus and former (Raleigh) News & Observer reporter, Nikole Hannah-Jones was named a 2017 MacArthur Genius Grant Fellow (one of only 24 people chosen, globally) for "reshaping national conversations around education reform" and for her reporting on racial resegregation in our schools. She's won a Peabody, a Polk, and, in 2017, a National Magazine Award for her story on choosing a school for her daughter in a segregated city.

Nikole Hannah-Jones covers racial injustice for *The New York Times Magazine*, and has spent years chronicling the way official policy has created—and maintains—racial segregation in housing and schools. She has written extensively on the history of racism, school resegregation, and the disarray of hundreds of desegregation orders, as well as the decades-long failure of the federal government to enforce the landmark 1968 Fair Housing Act. She is currently writing a book on school segregation called *The Problem We All Live With*, to be published on the One World imprint of Penguin/Random House.
